

Message From the Festival Of Trees Committee

This year has presented many significant and unique challenges for all of us. With the onset of the corona virus pandemic, the Springfield Garden Club has made many program changes as we have acknowledged the uncertain and evolving situation created by the pandemic. Our primary concern throughout these past months is the safety of our members and that of the community.

The FOT Committee is disappointed to report that in spite of our best intensions, our plans for decorating the Great Hall have been cancelled. This decision was made for three reasons.

- 1. The Springfield Medical Care Systems has seen an uptick in virus cases and has therefore implemented stricter regulations regarding who can enter their offices through the Great Hall. They asked if SGC members could limit visits and work to nights and weekends. The planning became too complicated and we didn't feel this would work for members.
- 2. Because of these new regulations, it's likely the number of visitors to the Great Hall will be significantly reduced and therefore our "audience" will be reduced as well. The FOT Committee felt that the time and effort required for decorating wouldn't have the community impact we had hoped for.
- 3. Because the number of virus cases is increasing, the committee decided that now was not a good time to encourage several of our members to gather together. As we head into the holidays we don't want to risk any of our members becoming ill.

Meanwhile the FOT committee and several members have been busy. We have mailed fundraising letters to local businesses who have supported us in the past, as well as people who normally attend the event and buy tickets. The silent auction and raffle team is busy hand delivering a similar letter to their donors. A letter also went out last week to members asking for your support as well. These steps will go a long way toward helping us fund our important civic beautification and scholarship programs.

Good news...wonderful comments are coming in from our efforts so far. We have many generous friends and supporters and we have much to be thankful for. However, we are short of our goal to support next year's important civic beautification and scholarship programs. The Club will continue to seek financial support via a press release and a Facebook posting coming out later this week. The safety and health of our membership and our community will continue to guide our choices in this process.
